



## Trump's battle against Fake News! The inefficiency of the UN

This week delegates met at UN Head Quarters to discuss the rampant use and polarization of misinformation and disinformation currently happening all across the globe on fake news sites such as CNN. Representatives of our great president Donald J. Trump, to the surprise of nobody, has been at the UN leading the conversation on Artificial Intelligence, misinformation, and disinformation.

Representatives have continually expressed their concern about the danger that misinformation campaigns pose, speaking strongly about the dangers posed by unchecked media narratives and politically motivated reporting.
